Patty moved to approve. Marta seconded.

Passes via voice vote.

1. Welcome and introductions

- Jonny wants to keep the meeting moving quickly strict agenda timelines
- We're going to explore using a consent agenda
- Updating communication & web site
- More people moved into our neighborhood in the last 5 years than any neighborhood in the state

2. Neighborhood Officer Report

Canceled.

3. Baldwin/Elizabeth St. Stop Signs

Presentation by David, Tim and Ryan:

- Want council support to keep stop signs at Baldwin & Elizabeth permanent.
- Also want to add crosswalks
- Temporary stop signs in place already at their instigation due to increased traffic from construction on Johnson.
- Concerned about speed and amount of traffic, lots of kids crossing for school, has noticed appreciable benefit from temporary stop signs.
- Sherman to Gorham stretch of N Baldwin.
- Survey of neighbors on Baldwin
 - They went out on two occasions and spent 45 hours knocking on doors in the 300 and 400 blocks of N Baldwin
 - Overwhelmingly in support of permanent stop signs
 - 21/45 neighbors came to door and took survey

- 75% said saw decreased auto speeds and safer driving, 99% said safer pedestrian crossing; 90.5% in favor of making stop signs permanent; 20/21 said support reflective crosswalk.
- Jonny got 16 emails in support of keeping stop signs, 0 against, 5 add'l neighbors spoke with and were supportive.

Discussion:

- Jonny: Traffic Engineering in process of considering whether to keep signs permanent
- Keith: move to write letter to make permanent
 - Marta: second with move to amend that support adding crosswalks
- Patty: clarification no crosswalks at all there
- Pat Kelly: concerned with asking Traffic Engineering for this when we're about to ask them for a whole list of stuff re traffic calming; would rather include this issue in the list than write the letter
- Patty: TE said want to take care of neighborhoods that are less advantaged then we are; but asked what we wanted and we said temporary stop signs, easy for them to do
- Patrick: advice concerns about equity, if we get this, there is possibility could impact
 our success at advocacy in the future, but as David said the stop signs are already there,
 it's a question of whether TE is going to take them out, so would like to take advantage
 of it; one thing to consider is whether was a demand for stop signs before construction;
 but overall doesn't think it's a big request to make the existing signs permanent
- Bob: I'm conducting evaluation on traffic issues in neighborhood, two meetings coming up, by mid-Dec should have prioritized neighborhood-wide traffic/transportation safety issues that we can take to Traffic Engineering dept.;
 - has talked to TE about this issue, not a done deal that signs remain in place;
 Madison Metro goes up Baldwin and has significant input, may have concern that stop signs are slowing down their times; sympathetic to neighbors saying already there leave it there, but not heard from rest of city depts.
 - asked TE if could keep stop signs on Baldwin till end of January so could evaluate these signs in conjunction with what rest of neighborhood wants
 - should demonstrate that signs are effective (no studies done on before/after stop signs), through study done by TE
 - recommend put off endorsing this until February meeting when Bob's study is done
- Keith: amend motion to write a letter letting TE know we're considering neighborhood input and requesting that they not remove the current stop sign till study is completed (February 2020)
 - o Pat Kelly: second
- Jonny: did this issue of traffic exist before construction?
- Tim: Yes, definitely, gotten worse with construction; would agree that best process for traffic calming is overall evaluation, but feel that this is a separate issue because stop signs are already there and are proven to work in our experience, don't want to risk losing this
- Jonny: TE is considering this now, if we wait till January might have made their conclusion and we won't have another chance to weigh in; TE doesn't go through process of looking at comprehensive plans, they only take it on project by project, so we're going to have to squeaky wheel project by project anyway
- Nick: so for TE we don't know what the timeline is?

- Bob: I got commitment from TE to keep stop sign there through January
- Jonny: but are evaluating right now, based on correspondence I saw
- Wes: this is about advocating for safety more broadly right?
- Pat: pedestrian crossing islands and stoplight half a block away?
- Baldwin residents: not enough (Marta concurs)
- Wes: but how can we advocate for safety in absence of stop sign
- Patty: not a conflict between two things, writing a letter saying in support of stop signs while also working on plan, doesn't think harm to write a support letter
- Tim Olson: extract promise from city to leave it there? PR campaigns march kids/bikes at safety issue areas, invite TV coverage did all this in the past
- Keith: if get them to delay removal, will become status quo, maybe less likely to remove later?
- Jonny: but they're evaluating this now (Bob contests this); need to vote on whether support amended motion to ask TE to wait for removal of sign
- Keith: to restate: Motion is to write letter saying considered neighborhood input and consensus signs would be good to keep, but pending study ask that not be removed till March
- Motion passes.
- Patrick: Citywide plan to deal with Traffic Calming, city wants information to figure out how to allocate resources (use a ranking system for what's highest need, limited \$ in the pot; current ranking system being reconsidered); not as easy as just asking
- Patty: just voted to write letter to maintain stop sign, delay on removal

5. Traffic Calming Meetings - Bob

- Meeting at Lyric 11/19 at 7 pm, to identify issues with traffic in the neighborhood
- Going to present findings on Dec. 9 meeting to decide priorities (yikes)
- Will present to council on Dec. 12 meeting
- Encourage us to email concerns/attend meeting
- Want to come up with a plan, next time have construction/etc can refer to plan to see about incorporating ideas; living doc adjunct to neighborhood plan
- Conversation with Wes/Pat/Patrick
 - very few of our wants will actually be funded by TE
 - Anything is more likely if we can include it as part of a development project
- Jonny: let's keep in conversation with surrounding neighborhoods/presidents/alders to integrate plans
- Patrick: need to encourage TE to take holistic approach too; also consider methods of ranking (most impact for safety? Most expensive? Etc)

6. Parks Input - Pat Kelly

- Any concerns about parks?
- Ryan: Excited about project to make swimming area
- Patrick: County has control over lakes; city is parks themselves/beaches
- Pat: mossy steps by the beach seem dangerous

- Tim: needed to retain sand on the beach
- They aren't supposed to be steps into the water
- The city brings in truckloads of sand every year
- Patty has a connection who's active in park volunteerism Gigi Holland and will hook her up with Pat
- Ted Olson Ed Jepsen does volunteering for Tenney Park, spearheaded lots of projects
- Evelyn: trash in Reynolds Park Patrick has info for Pat on this
 - o Bob: Streets should be able to put a trash can on the terrace

6A. Chair Reports

- Gwen: Nothing to report for Business
- Patty: We got a nice card from Marquette School
- Jonny: Want to support Events chair more
- Marta: bring back Spaghetti Dinner
- Nick: funds at UW now under Jonny & Nick's control; putting together budget committee; participatory budgeting – looking into will report more later
 - o Bob: want budget sheet/treasurer report for each meeting; Nick says ok

7. Elected Official report – Patrick

- City budget just finished
- Approved funding for first steps of working towards Vision 0 (approach to road design that focuses on reducing crashes that involve bodily injury and death – designing around people rather than cars)
- Defeated Alder Rummel asked for TID \$ from Cap East to put in infrastructure to allow RR not to blow horns; Patrick opposed bc thinks whole community should be involved in figure out how to use this money (affordable housing, traffic safety etc, donate to more impoverished neighborhood)
 - Alder Rummel and Patrick directed funding for a study for community engagement to see how should use \$
- Dec 2, 5-7 public meeting at Grace Coffee for input on liquor license
 - Jonny wont chair liquor license meetings, ask for volunteers to come to meeting
- Salvation Army dev approved by Plan Commission; still have to raise \$\$ so lots of hurdles still
- East Gorham sewer replacement from Franklin to Livingston going to happen in 2020, will be pubic process
 - Could be a three month project
- Dec 8 Santa Run
- Funding for bike path clearing on Weekends
- The city will file action about the illegal parking lot
 - o They've been fined every day starting November 1
- E Johnson construction should be done November 15 (tomorrow)
- Funds for 3 new police officers, independent police monitor

• City started this budget cycle \$11 million in the red and will likely get worse b/c of state legislature limiting the ability to raise revenue.
