Everyone is invited to bring a dessert to pass and your favorite card, board, or party game to share.


HOUSING SERVICES PROGRAM REPORTS

The office of the Tenney-Lapham Corporation's HOUSING SERVICES PROGRAM has opened in the Lapham School Building (Room 123) with special thanks going to those neighbors and friends of the program who have generously loaned or donated furniture and office equipment.

To keep members of the Neighborhood up to date, our progress will regularly be reported to the Newsletter. However, Please feel welcome to drop in at our office and talk to Mary Kay Garrow, the Project Director, at anytime.

For those of you who are unfamiliar with the HOUSING SERVICES PROGRAM, a brief overview may be in order. The Tenney-Lapham Corporation has received a grant from the city to operate a housing program at the neighborhood level which will respond to the needs of residents of this particular area. Specifically, we will be assisting homeowners in finding financing for home improvements that they plan to undertake, counseling them on the work that they may want to include in their rehabilitation efforts, assisting in finding bonafide contractors to do the job. and even providing first-time homebuyers with information relative to city programs that may assist them in making a purchase and rehabbing at the same time they buy.

As you know, much of the housing stock in the Tenney-Lapham Neighborhood is older, yet structurally sound. The increased costs of energy, land, and materials; and the concomitant scarcity of new housing, makes it increasingly more evident that we need to preserve our homes and our neighborhoods for the future.

MARQUETTE KINDERGARTEN Class of 1980-81

Marquette Elementary School requested a full-time Kindergarten teacher for the 1980-81 school year; however, Glenn Borland at Central Administration has allocated only a half-time Kindergarten teacher. This decision was based on the assumption that declining enrollment will continue.

The Marquette Parent-Teacher Group is taking steps to increase the allocation to a full-time teacher. One goal is to identify all potential Kindergarteners. If you have a child who will be five by October 1, 1980 and/or know of such children in the Tenney-Lapham Neighborhood, call Sue Fieber at 251-3909 and give her their names.

Another goal is to get as many Kinder-garteners as possible to enroll at Marquette during the <u>Spring enrollment period</u>. This year the dates are April 21-25. You may enroll your child during the day from 8:30-11:00 a.m. or 1-3 p.m. all week and on Tuesday evening, April 22, from 7-8 p.m.

Go into the Elementary School through the triple doors that face Jenifer Street.

Even if you are not sure whether you will be here in the Fall, you are encouraged to enroll. It doesn't cost anything, and there is no penalty if you transfer to another school in the fall.


DENTAL WELLNESS WORKSHOP

Do you know that 90% of the American population has periodontal disease? Would you like to learn whether or not your mouth is healthy and ways you can maintain proper dental wellness?


