## BE WISE: WEATHERIZE

The Community Action Commission (CAC), located at 1045 E. Dayton, has recently been able to expand their weatherization program. The following information may be of interest to home owners.

**Home Energy Audit**--If you qualify, a comprehensive home energy audit will be conducted by our energy auditors. The auditor will visit your home and conduct a detailed assessment of your home's weatherization needs. You will have the opportunity to ask questions or express any concerns you may have before the work actually begins on the home.

**Weatherization Services**--Upon completion of your audit and certification of your eligibility, your home will be scheduled for weatherization services. The amount and type of work will vary with up to \$583 worth of weatherization materials that can be installed by one of our fifteen professional weatherization crews that will provide the labor necessary to complete your home.

### Weatherization Services Include--

- 1) Replace broken glass, 2) Replace window sash locks, 3) Use weatherstripping and caulking to seal air leaks, 4) Wrap hot weather heater with insulation blanket, 5) Cement mortar or patch foundation walls, 6) Install gable, roof, and soffets, 7) Properly vent attic, 8) Side wall insulation, 9) Foundation insulation, 10) Attic insulation, 11) Other types of work may be performed on your home as needed.

**Quality Control**--Once the work on your home is completed, a supervisor will return to your home to inspect the home for the quality of the work performed to insure your satisfaction.

The Weatherization Program may be able to assist you in saving 30-35% on your monthly energy bills through reduced consumption by weatherizing your home.

**Do You Qualify?** Your gross income must be for the past twelve (12) months:

Or head of household receiving SSI benefits for one year. If your gross income is less than the amount indicated above, you should qualify.

You only need to complete a simple application.

Provide income verification for the previous year (i.e., Social security statement, employment wage statement, AFDC certification, etc.)



All outdoor natural gas lights in Wisconsin must be disconnected by January 1, 1981, to comply with federal and state regulations. The only exceptions will be those lights specifically exempted by the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC) after review of a request for an exemption.

Customers must physically disconnect their light fixtures from the source of the natural gas. Merely keeping the lights turned off will not meet the requirements. MG&E customers with outdoor gas lights will be contacted by letter.

Customers who wish to apply for an exemption may contact the Public Service Commission or MG&E for an exemption form. Call the PSC at 266-2001 or write them at the Hill Farms State Office Building, 4802 Sheboygan Avenue, Madison 53702, or call MG&E at 252-7084.

Your gas meter doesn't have to be gray

If "gas-meter gray" doesn't fit well with your exterior decorating scheme, you can improve the look of your home by painting to match.

--Don't get paint on the dial cover, the identification plate showing the meter number, or the vent screen on the regulator next to your gas meter.

--Don't use metallic paint, such as aluminum or gold.

--Do consider using a rust-preventive paint. It will give added protection from the weather.
