



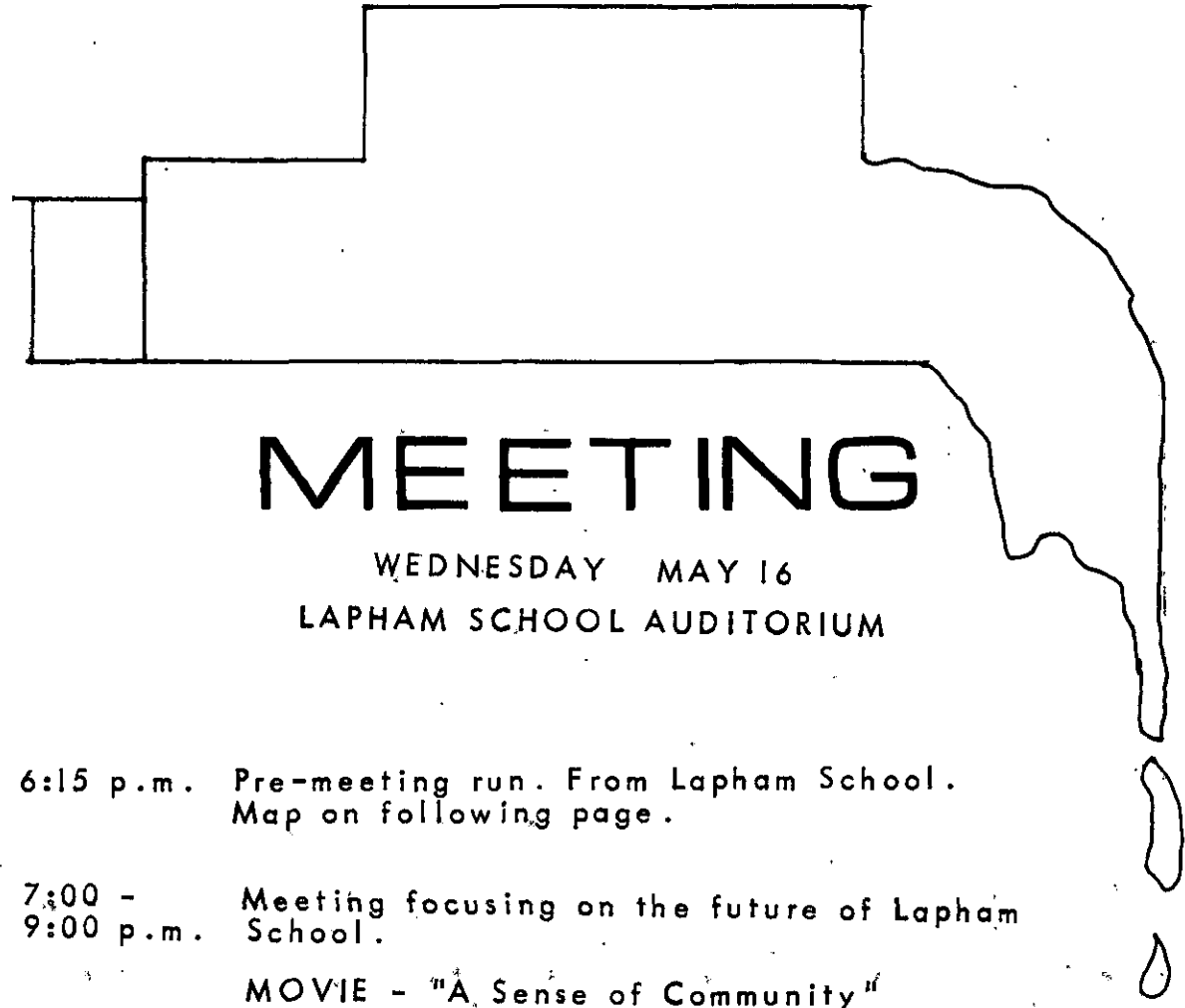

UNSETTLED

The disposition of the Lapham School building continues to be a matter of concern. Several options are being studied by the school district administration but no official recommendation has yet been made.

On April 22, the TLNA, in conjunction with the Spring Harbor and Hawthorne neighborhood associations, took a strong position in favor of a long-term lease arrangement for the school.

Under such a lease, the building could continue to serve as a public facility. Neighborhood services could be located there, and access for neighborhood meetings and community education could continue.

In addition, the lease arrangement would allow the school district to reclaim the building for future use as a school if necessary.

Several members of the City Council, as well as Mayor Skornicka, have expressed support for the concept of the long-term lease. Further action will await recommendations by the school district administration.

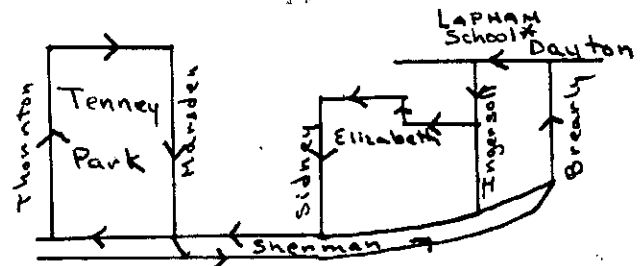
"SIGNS" OF SPRING
