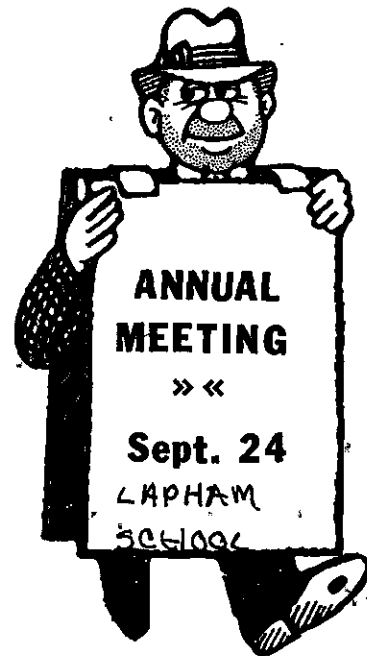

IT'S TIME TO JOIN (OR RE-JOIN) THE NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION

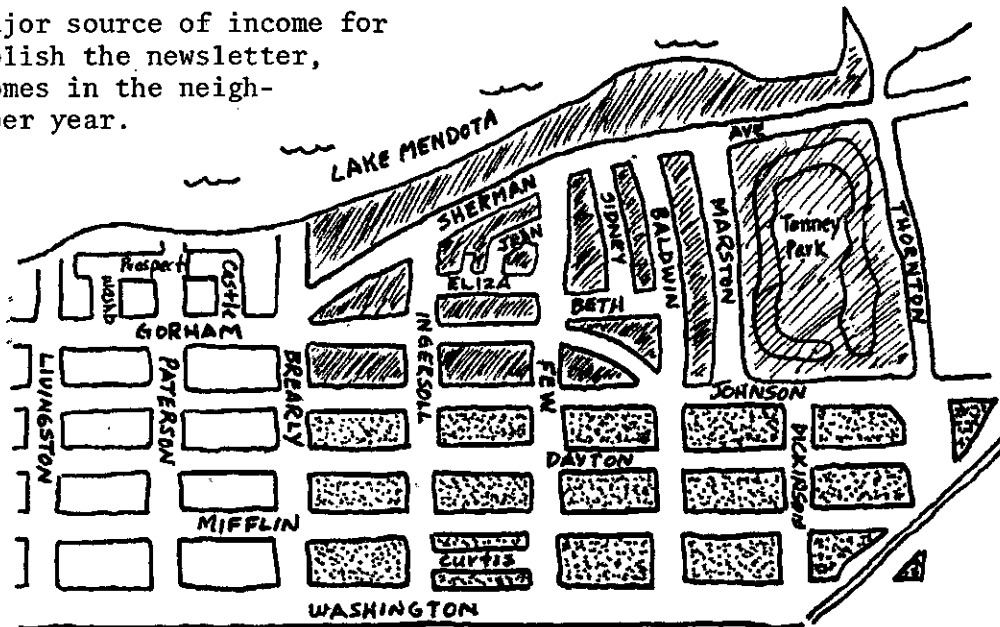
The Tenney Lapham Neighborhood Association membership year ends in September. Now is the time to re-new your membership or to join for the first time.

RESTORATION & RENOVATION - 1014 E. GORHAM

Tenney Lapham residents have noticed a lot of work going on at 1014 E Gorham this summer. The renovation of this 1870's home is being done by the Madison Trust for Historic Preservation. It is the first of the Trust's Revolving Fund projects aimed at preserving the social and physical integrity of older neighborhoods.

The renovation will demonstrate how to modernize an older home to today's standards of utility, design and energy-efficiency while enhancing its architectural character. It will also bring the two existing units into condominium ownership, with one unit targeted for a low-to-moderate income family.

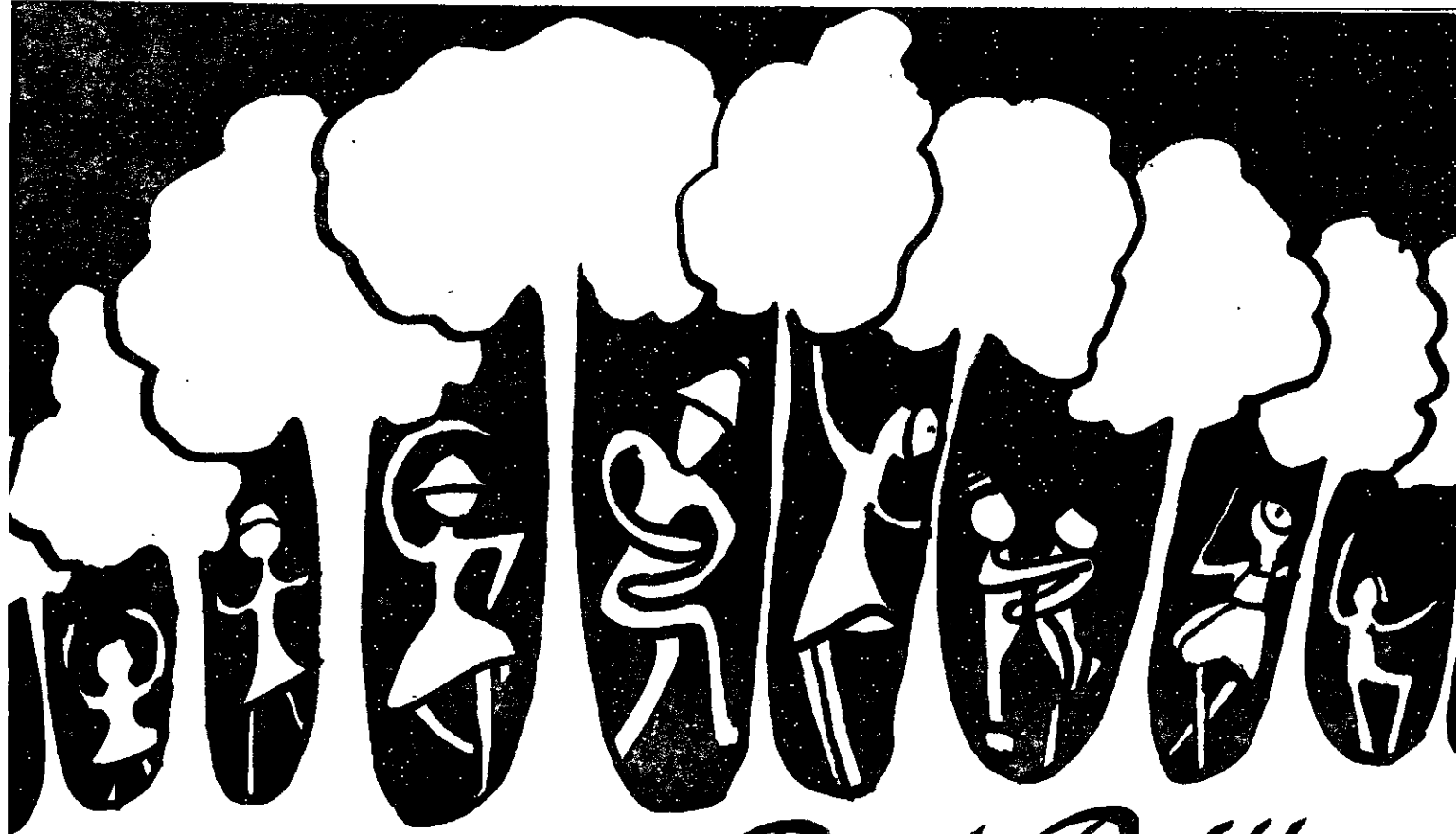
Led by volunteer coordinator Gigi Holland, much of the work is completed with new plumbing, heating and wiring installed. By early October, the house should be finished, complete with restored trim and a three-color paint scheme to grace the facade. At that time, the Trust will sell the two units and move on to another project. (for sales information, call John Rolling, at 251-3421).

A reception for neighborhood residents will be held at the house on Thursday, Sept 17, from 5 to 7 pm. This will be a chance to view the work in progress. People who plan to renovate their own homes may also wish to attend on-site workshops demonstrating ways to restore wooden exteriors. These will be held on two Saturdays, Sept 26 and Oct 3.
